

Stoptober is back

The Public Health England and NHS Stoptober campaign started on 1st October. CNHC is encouraging registrants to support this public health initiative by making patients aware of the variety of services available to help quit smoking.

Hypnotherapy may help clients achieve behavioural change to stop smoking, and CNHC is encouraging the public to check our register if they plan to use hypnotherapy to support them during the campaign.

We have also developed a press release for CNHC registered Hypnotherapists to approach local media outlets. While Stoptober is a campaign in its own right, it now falls under the umbrella of the OneYou campaign, which encourages the public to make small and practical changes to enhance their overall health and wellbeing.

CNHC exhibit at The King's Fund

CNHC exhibited at The King's Fund Event 'Enhanced health and wellbeing in care homes' on Thurs 19 September.

The event had attendees from the care home sector, including managers, directors, service coordinators and other care home staff. There were also council leads, NHS Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) leads and health care professionals in attendance.

Conversations were held with many delegates, discussing the role of CNHC and our registrants in the wider public health workforce. Key contacts were made with care home managers and service coordinators, requesting CNHC leaflets and information to signpost to the public and relevant staff.



Update on Profession Specific Board (PSB) Elections

In the last issue we set out details of the election process for the Aromatherapy, Reflexology and Shiatsu Profession Specific Boards (PSBs).

Sometimes when CNHC holds Profession Specific Board (PSB) elections, the number of candidates who put themselves forward is fewer than the minimum number of five required to hold an election. When that happens, CNHC invites those who stepped forward (and who meet the criteria) to take up the position and on occasion also invites existing PSB members to continue in the role, if they wish to do so. This approach works well by providing a good combination of continuity and newness to the PSBs' work.

This was the case for all three therapies this time round which means a continuity of members on the Aromatherapy PSB and a combination of new and existing members in the Reflexology and Shiatsu PSBs as detailed below:
