NICE real-world evidence framework

The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) launched their real-world evidence framework in October.

Real-world data is data that is collected outside of a highly controlled clinical trial. It can be routinely collected during the delivery of health or social care. Real-world evidence is the evidence generated from the analysis of real-world data.

The framework aims to advance the use of real-world evidence in NICE guidance.
